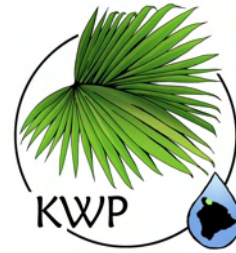


Kohala Watershed Partnership

Watershed Conservation Intern (2). These interns will be working with the KWP field crew on various watershed projects including invasive weed control, propagation and outplanting of native species, and sediment control. Additionally, the interns may be trained in basic techniques of GPS and/or scientific monitoring. Looking for individuals who enjoy manual work outdoors in extreme weather and rough terrain, and who are eager to learn about watershed conservation in Hawai'i.
