These positions will perform biological surveys, assist with data collection and analysis, and assist with report preparation for a variety of natural resources projects in Hawaii. Responsibilities:

- Conducts field surveys or other research and accurately collects data under the direction of a project manager;
- Assists in gathering equipment, meeting materials, or other project related items as directed;
- Organizes and tracks project related data using databases or other methods;
- Efficiently uses field and office equipment related to performance of tasks, i.e., Trimble GPS units, computers running Windows and Microsoft Products, digital cameras, etc.;
- Operates SWCA vehicles during on and off-road conditions; and
- Assists in report preparation under the direction and supervision of Resource Specialists and Project Manager.

Qualifications:

Exceptions to the below qualifications may be made for applicants that can demonstrate comparable experience.

- Minimum of B.A. or B.S. in a natural resource science, planning, or other field related to natural/biological resources.
- One or more years of experience in field data collection, or similar experience, preferred.
- Ability to gather data accurately and legibly.
- Some knowledge of Hawaiian plants and invasive plant species is preferred.
- Flexibility and ability to adapt to rapidly changing conditions and schedules including some evening and weekend work.
- Physical ability to conduct fieldwork for long hours, in sometimes inclement weather conditions, and ability to carry equipment and supplies weighing up to 40 pounds.
- Ability to operate a four-wheel drive vehicle in a safe manner, during on and off-road conditions.
- The successful candidate should have flexibility and willingness to learn company procedures, ability to try new, improved techniques, make independent decisions when appropriate to the situation and make adjustments as a member of a team in order to complete tasks in the most efficient and accurate manner.
