

BIOLOGICAL AND MAINTENANCE VOLUNTEER POSITIONS at Tern Island Field Station for Sept 2012-March 2013 for U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service. Come join us in studying seabirds on a remote island 500 miles northwest of Honolulu! Tern Island has a 30 year biological monitoring history. This is a life-changing, wonderful place -- but also very challenging. There are no ships or planes between when we are dropped off in Sept, and when we're picked up in March, so we need volunteers with long-term remote and backcountry experience. Because health services are limited, and evacuation times very long, volunteers must be in good physical health, with no outstanding health issues, for safety of the individual and the group. Only 4-6 people are on island during the winter, so you must be able to work as a team; everyone helps with all tasks. Biological work is primarily seabird monitoring.
