If you are a science educator, the Hō'ike o Haleakalā curriculum was made for you! The result of several years' collaboration between Maui school teachers and natural resource managers, this multi-disciplinary curriculum establishes a strong science background, critical thinking skills and a dedication to resource stewardship. It includes four **Hawai'i-specific** modules for classroom and field use: **Alpine/Aeolian, Rain Forest, Coastal, and Marine**. Modules investigate the biology, geology, cultural history, and conservation issues associated with each ecosystem. Engaging lessons include group activities, games, slide shows, media aids, journal topics, and in-depth research projects. Originally designed for high school science classrooms, lessons can be adapted for English, political science, Hawaiian or social studies. All material is tied to Hawai'i DOE standards. Development and promotion are provided by Haleakalā National Park and the Maui Invasive Species Committee.
