THE YEAR 1992 SHOWED A DEFINITE INCREASE IN THE INTEREST IN NATIVE PLANTS. THERE
WERE A NUMBER OF WORKSHOPS, ACTIVITIES, ARTICLES AND IN GENERAL, MORE INTEREST FROM THE
PUBLIC. THE NHPS ALSO INCREASED AND CONCENTRATED ITS EFFORTS TO MAINTAIN AND IMPROVE OUR
NUMEROUS PLANT SANCTUARIES. OUR 1992 MONTHLY SCHEDULE OF MAINTENANCE WAS AN IMPROVEMENT.

THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS HAS BEEN PLANNING LONG RANGE GOALS FOR EVERY PLANT SANCTUARY.

THIS WOULD INCLUDE MORE MAINTENANCE, PLANT PROPAGATION, RECORD KEEPING, PLANTINGS, ETC.

OUR 1991 SURVEY SHOWED THAT A LOT OF PEOPLE ARE INTERESTED IN LEARNING ABOUT AND SAVING

OUR NATIVE SPECIES. HOWEVER, AT TIMES, MEMBER PARTICIPATION WAS NOT INDICATIVE OF OUR

SURVEY RESULTS. THE NHPS (AND THE NATIVE PLANTS) WOULD APPRECIATE MORE PARTICIPATION IN

1993. PERHAPS, A BRIEF RECAP OF OUR PLANT SANCTUARIES MIGHT HELP TO RENEW DEDICATIONS

TOWARDS HELPING OUR NATIVE SPECIES.

AUWAHI EXCLOSURES -- A SERIES OF NINE EXCLOSURES ON THE SOUTHWEST SLOPE OF HALEAKALA

(3000-4000 * ELEV.) PROTECTS MANY SPECIES OF A ONCE VERY DIVERSE AND RICH AREA OF MESIC

FOREST. FUTURE PLANS INCLUDE PROPAGATION AND REPLANTING OF MANY OF THE RARE AND NOT SO

RARE SPECIES.

LA PEROUSE EXCLOSURE -- A SMALL EXCLOSURE IN THE MIDDLE OF A LAVA FLOW IT IS AN EXCELLENT EXAMPLE OF HOW NATIVE PLANTS HAVE ADAPTED TO AN EXTREMELY HARSH ENVIRONMENT.

Hibiscus brackenridgei EXCLOSURE--LOCATED JUST SOUTH OF THE WAIKAPU GOLF COURSE,

THE TARGET PLANT IS Hibiscus brackenridgei (MAO HAU HELE). THE BEAUTIFUL YELLOW FLOWERED HIBISCUS IS OUR STATE FLOWER BUT IS EXTREMELY RARE IN ITS NATURAL HABITAT.

GRESSITT RARE PLANT SANCTUARY -- A SIXTY ACRE PLANT SANCTUARY LOCATED ABOVE MAHINAHINA
ON WEST MAUI, IT INCLUDES NUMEROUS SPECIES NATIVE TO THE AREA AND THE NHPS HAS PLANTED
AND HAS PLANS TO PLANT MANY MORE RARE SPECIES.

KANAHA POND WILDLIFE SANCTUARY -- IN COOPERATION WITH THE STATE OF HAWAII, NHPS HAS

NUMEROUS PLANT SITES WITHIN THE SANCTUARY. AN EXCELLENT EXAMPLE OF NATIVE COASTAL PLANTS,

THE SANCTUARY IS ALSO USED BY THE NHPS FOR EDUCATIONAL FIELD TRIPS AS BOTH CHILDREN AND

ADULTS BENEFIT.



STRIKINGLY YELLOW FLOWERED HIBISCUS. SIZE/SHAPE VARIES FROM SHRUB
TO SMALL TREE. FOUND ON ALL MAIN ISLANDS EXCEPT NIIHAU AND
KAHOOLAWE. RARE IN ITS NATIVE HABITAT (DRY,LOW ELEV. SHRUBLANDS).

EASILY GROWN (CUTTINGS/SEEDS) FROM CULTIVATED PLANTS. ATTRACTIVE
ORNAMENTAL, NEEDS FULL SUN, GOOD DRAINAGE. USED BY TRADITIONAL
HEALERS IN MEDICINAL PRACTICES.



992 CHAIRPERSON'S MESSAGE

The year 1992 showed a definite increase in the interest in native plants. There were a number of workshops, activities, articles and in general, more interest from the public. The NHPS also increased and concentrated its efforts to maintain and improve our numerous plant sanctuaries. Our 1992 monthly schedule of maintenance was an improvement.

The Board of Directors has been planning long range goals for every plant sanctuary. This would include more maintenance, plant propagation, record keeping, plantings, etc. Our 1991 survey showed that a lot of people are interested in learning about and saving our native species. However, at times, member participation was not indicative of our survey results. The NHPS (and the native plants) would appreciate more participation in 1993. Perhaps, a brief recap of our plant sanctuaries might help to renew dedications towards helping our native species.

AUWAHI EXCLOSURES -- A series of nine exclosures on the southwest slope of Haleakala (3000-4000' elev.) protects many species of a once very diverse and rich area of mesic forest. Future plans include propagation and replanting of many of the rare and not so

rare species.

Hibiscus brackenridgei EXCLOSURE -- Located just south of the Walkapu Golf Course, the target plant is Hibiscus brackenridgei (MAO HAU HELE). The beautiful yellow flowered hibiscus is our state flower but is extremely rare in its natural habitat.

GRESSITT RARE PLANT SANCTUARY -- A sixty acre plant sanctuary located above Mahinahina on West Maui. It includes numerous species native to the area and the NHPS has planted
